Watergate was a 1970's political scandal in which members of U.S. President Nixon's administration were caught organizing, carrying out and covering up a plot to spy on political opponents. The name "Watergate" comes from the Watergate Hotel, where the Democratic Party's National Committee offices were broken into on June 17, 1972. Chuck Colson became involved in 1971, in an attempt to discredit Daniel Ellsberg. Colson and others came up with a scheme to steal information from the office of Ellsberg's psychiatrist. Ellsberg had been responsible for releasing military documents which had a major influence on the American public and helped increase opposition to the Vietnam War. For that reason, President Nixon considered Ellsberg an enemy. Colson later pleaded guilty to obstruction of justice in the matter of the Ellsberg break-in.
